- 6. Polish sacral architecture after the Second Vatican Council. Stanisław Niemczyk the great master of sacral architecture.
- 7. The phenomenon of contemporary sacral Scandinavian architecture. "Poor architecture"
- 8. Changing the functions of sacred architecture. Phenomenon of sacrum.
- 9. The great masters of sacral architecture Mario Botta, Peter Zumthor, Alvaro Siza, John Pawson.
- 10. Searching for new directions in the sacral architecture today.
